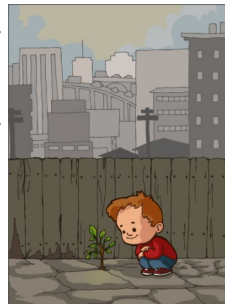


Weddings
