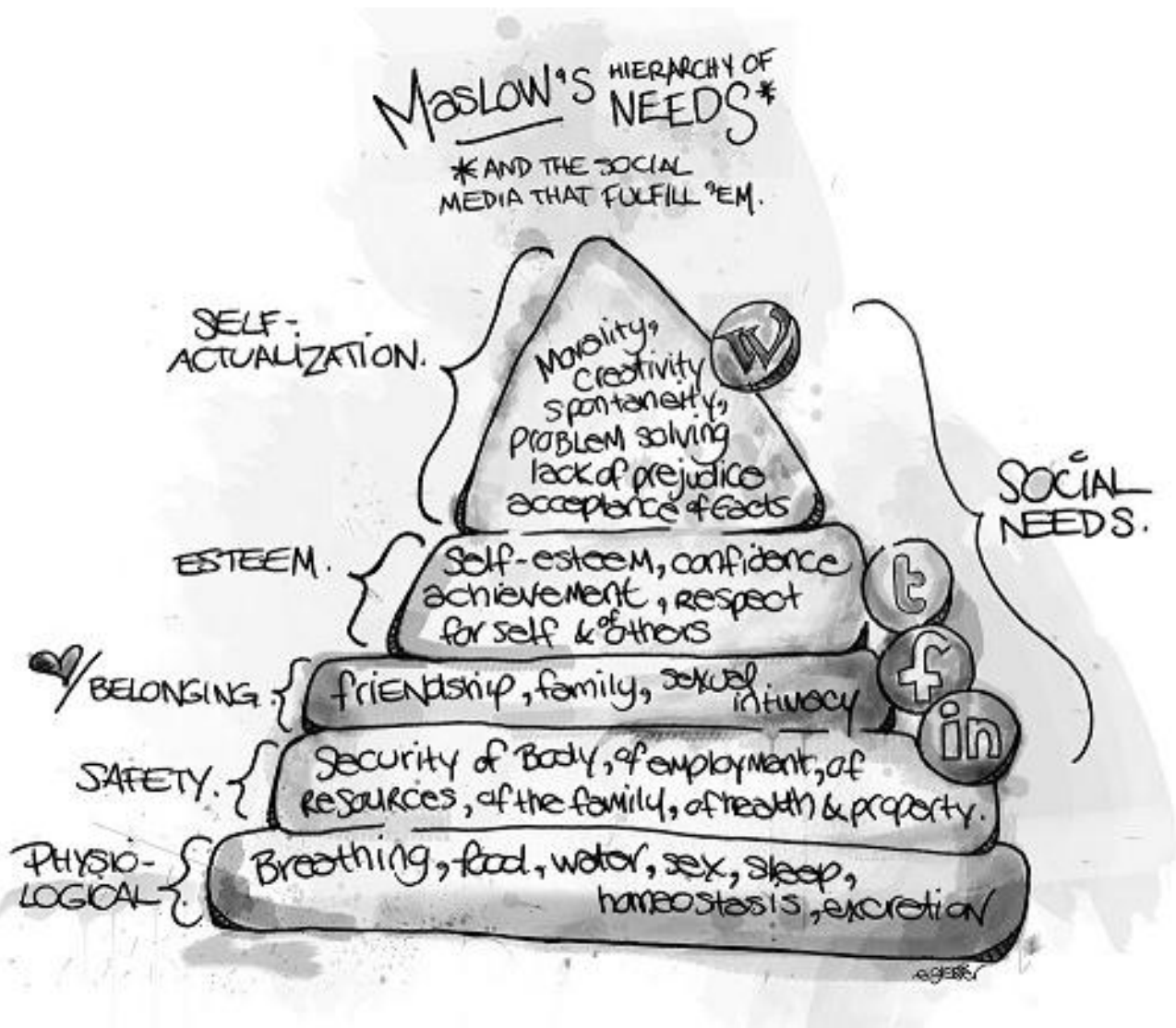

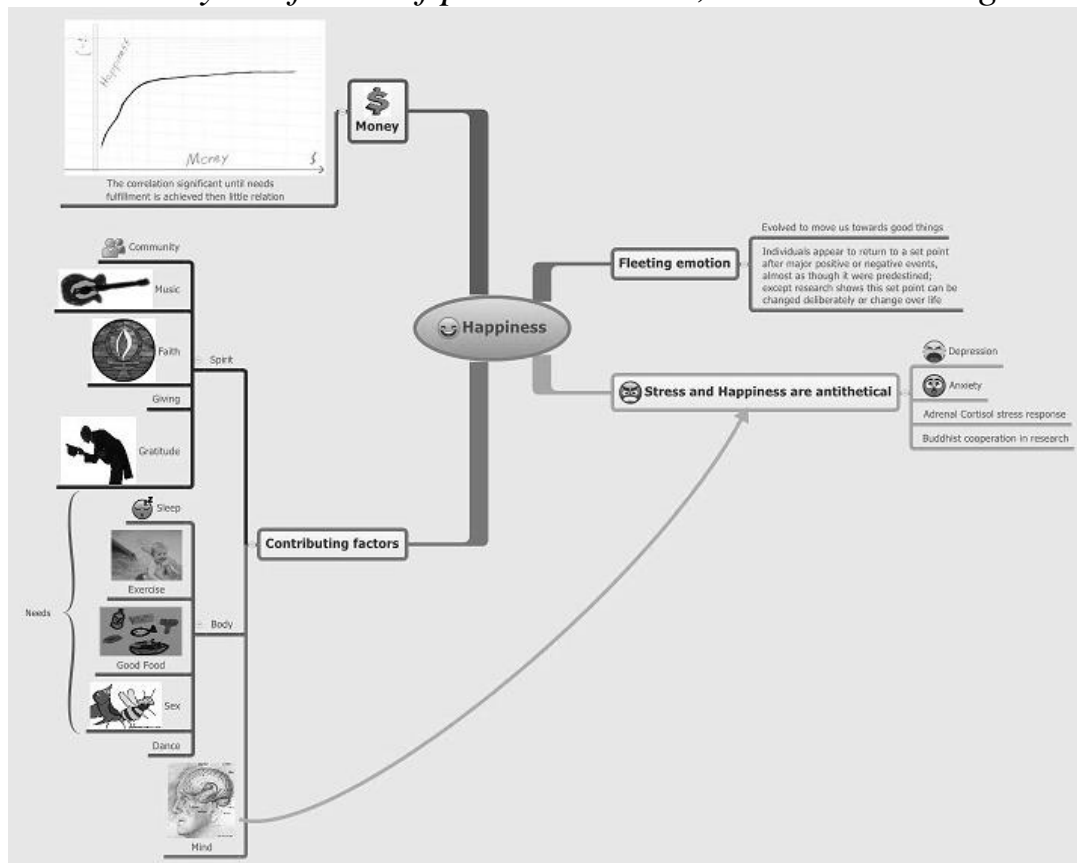

FOR SALE 4 lovely duck egg pots, in excellent condition, 3 of which you can see under the stairs in the Sanctuary foyer. One is still in the Sanctuary by the SW door. The largest one is 19 inches in diameter and 18.5 inches in height with a green interior. Another is 19 inches in diameter and 18 inches in height. The other two are 19.5 inches in diameter and 17 inches in height, with turquoise interiors. These pots have become quite rare; one in adequate condition is selling for \$100 on Main Street.
